Live Every Day Like It's Your Last **Sondra Jones**

I sat there stunned at Emily's kitchen table. I was scrolling through Facebook and found a post by a group of women that said we had lost another friend, has given me, even if it hadn't Lura, and she "was gone too soon". I could not believe this to be true. I quickly texted a friend and she called saying it was, in fact, true. She had died in a freak scuba accident in Mexico the day before. We both sobbed on the phone. Talked about her joyous spirit and love for adventure and the "unrealness" of it. We also talked briefly about her family and then said good-bye. I texted several friends to make sure they knew and then I sat praving for her family and friends. I cried a great deal that day.

Why, you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes." James 4:14 (NIV)

There is no way for us to know when our last day on Earth is going to be. I couldn't help but ask myself if I was taking for granted the time God was giving me here. I wondered if I

would have regrets had her last day been my last day. I began to ponder if I was truly enjoying and embracing the life God turned out the way I thought it would or should. I couldn't help but ask myself if I was embracing waking up every morning and being given another day, or if I was spending time being unhappy because of difficult circumstances instead of living with joy.

In Psalm 90:12, the psalmist reminds us that all of our days are numbered and none of us know how many we will have: "Teach us to use wisely all the time we have." Therefore, we should all live as if the present day is our last. If we actually did this, would we live differently? We might:

- Think more positively.
- Forgive quicker.
- Step out of our comfort zones and do that thing God has been calling us to do.
- Anger slower.
- Spend more time with loved ones.

- Make more time for ourselves.
- Allow ourselves to have fun.
- Hug others more.

When you consider that our entire lifetime is but a moment to God, it becomes apparent that it is important to make each moment count. Our life is brief on this earth but forever in Eternity. Shouldn't we try to live each day to impact Eternity? Influencing others for the Kingdom would be a start. Thanking God for our blessings instead of wishing we had what our neighbors have, would also be a start. I feel like many of us, and that includes me, are so busy we forget to stop and appreciate all the glorious bless ings God has placed around us. Just laughter with my church family is a wondrous gift to me. When our time is consumed with earthly things, it becomes impossible to make a difference in the Kingdom of God. God knows just how many days you have including each moment. He has a Plan for you that is good! (Jeremiah 29:11) *The Lord has* written it out carefully and precisely before "a single day had passed."

With Lura's sudden and unexpected death, I was vividly reminded of how fragile life is and the importance of appreciating every single moment God's given us and living life with a happy heart instead of a heavy one. What a shame we might waste the only life we have being grumpy all the time because we allow our problems and disappointments to steal our joy and shift our daily focus from thankfulness to unhappiness.

Whether we're facing a divorce, illness, financial hardships, loss of loved ones, relationship problems, unemployment, disappointment, crushed dreams — we can still make the intentional choice to be thankful for the life we have, even if it looks different than we want it to. We can still determine to enjoy the life God has given us and remember to thank Him every day for what we do have instead of focusing on what we don't. We can still choose to be happy, despite our circumstances. We all know people who are never happy in their circumstances. I know people who say, "Why don't I have....?", "Why wasn't I loved by....?", "Why did happen to me?", "Why did God punish me by doing?". Did a particular person come to mind? I call these "hard" people to love. I pray I am not one of them and try each day not to be!

Time is precious. We need to use the time we have in this life wisely and commit to waking up each day with the joy of Christ in our hearts and a smile on our faces. Wasting time being unhappy about the way life turns out is something I want to avoid — God wants us to enjoy the life He has designed for us. God is asking us to dream big and do the things He has set before us. Will you join me in shifting our perspective to have a kingdom view and stopping living life for only ourselves but for God's kingdom? You never know how your action may light a fire in someone else's life.

Ready, Set, Go! Lura died living one of her favorite adventures seeing some of God's great beauty. Let's live each day like it may be our last one and be ready for God's Kingdom and all the beauty it will hold.

RECPES

Zesty Ranch Drumsticks (or Thighs)

Ingredients:

8 (4 oz.) Chicken drumsticks or thighs

1 tsp. salt

- 1/2 tsp black pepper
- 1/4 cup dry ranch seasoning
- 1/2 cup panko bread crumbs
- 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese

Cooking spray

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat your Air Fryer to 375.
- 2. Sprinkle chicken with salt, pepper and ranch seasoning.

- 3. Dip the floured asparagus into the beaten eggs, allowing any excess to drip off.
- 4. In a paper lunch bag or large baggie, combine bread crumbs and parmesan cheese. Add chicken to the bag and shake to coat. Spritz with cooking spray.
- 5. Place chicken in air fryer basket and cook 20 minutes, turning halfway through cooking time , until the internal temperature reaches at least 165 degrees. Serve warm.

I like mine extra crispy so I cook mine just a little longer.

Mission U is a transformative educational program that encompasses both Bible-based curricula and events. All are welcome to engage with either or both components of Mission U.


Interested in deepening your faith in community? Gaining experience interpreting Scripture? Working toward healing for yourself, your community, and all of creation? Mission u is for you!
