

This is a question that all Christians wrestle with from time to time. Some Christians spend their lives working through the nuances of this seemingly simple question.

Imagine that you are approached by a stranger and asked, "What do you believe, spiritually speaking?"

Could you articulate your beliefs to another individual? Could you talk with some confidence about the United Methodist Church, how it operates, it's polity (Church organizational structure), and the church's theology (the spiritual lens by which United Methodists view the world)?

For most Christians, and especially for most United Methodists, knowing how the church operates and what spiritual truths we espouse, seems superfluous and unnecessary. Afterall, unless it interferes with our ability to sit in the pew and listen to the sermon on Sunday Morning, we don't really pay attention to anything.

But what about the committees and the business of the church? How do things get taken care of in the church? There has to be a process of deciding how to spend the church's income, a method of deciding what decorations and banners are on display in the sanctuary. Where and how does all of that get taken care of? Do you know?

How do we get pastors? Where do our offering funds go?

Who's in charge of buying the offering envelopes or stocking the kitchen?

And what about the beliefs of the United Methodist Church? Do you know who the "official" United Methodist Church spokesman or spokespeople are? What do we believe about Baptism; Communion?

Could you explain any of this to someone who asked you about your church?

See, part of the reason we don't want to participate in Evangelism (telling others about our church) is that we don't feel that we are equipped to answer basic questions about our church, its beliefs and its practice.

Which is why we are going to offer a class on United Methodist Beliefs and Practice here at St. John this fall. This is your opportunity to learn how the United Methodist Church operates and what we profess.

There will be three classes in total. The first class we will cover information on the General Conference and it's agencies, the Annual Conference and it's associated councils, and the operation and administration of the local church.

The second class will cover major United Methodist beliefs and theology and the last class will focus on St. John and it's administration and ministries.

Below are the meeting dates and times. The classes are completely free, but we ask that you sign up for the class so that we know how many books and curriculum to order. Classes will be offered both in the morning and in the evenings to accommodate everyone's schedule.

Light refreshments and snacks will be offered.
