

In the Fullness of Time

When the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son. Galatians 4:4 ESV

While our sense of time is shaped by our limited life spans, our impatience, our plans and agendas, our biological clocks, and the schedules us. God puts a promise deep within imposed on us by others, God's sense of time is impeccable. Sometimes we wish he'd hurry up, and other times we think he's already too late. But God knows when the harvest is ripe and ready, and because our faith harvests more than we think—it involves other people, occasions for testimony, and ongoing ripple effects in peripheral facets of our lives—he waits until it has the maximum fruit for the greatest number of people. For us, that's hard to handle. For him, it's the fullness of time.

The long-awaited Messiah is the prime example. God's people surely thought many earlier moments would have been perfect for the deliverer to come, but God worked for centuries for the intersection of cultures, the expectations of his people, and the religious climate of when the time is right, life comes an empire to come together in just the right way. In the minds of his people, this was long overdue. In the mind of God, the timing was perfect.

There are hints of pregnancy and

labor in today's verse—an appropriate metaphor for the seeds of faith that have been planted within the soil of our hearts, and we wait until the time of labor for its birth to come. That wait can seem uncomfortably and even painfully long. So can the labor pains we experience at the time of fulfillment; his promises often come forth with a bit of trauma. But while we wait, we nourish those seeds, watch over them, and create the right climate for them to grow. We are pregnant with the promises he has given.

God is teaching us the way of faith, so we rarely experience immediate answers to our asking. But that doesn't mean nothing is happening. Seasons shift, plans develop, conditions ripen, and the harvest is never late. God—the master gardener, the fulfiller of divine purposes, the giver of life—is at work. And forth. And it is always worth the wait.

After all Jeremiah 1:5 says, "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations." Either way, I can only imagine her anxiousness during the 9 months and wanting to see this Miracle, God's Son. An angel had to tell her Jesus was coming, so what a pregnancy she must have had!!

If THAT time, long ago, was perfect with all those "things" God deemed necessary colliding, how is to-day different? As I watch the commercials and see the commercialism of Christmas, haven't we forgotten why we have the season in the first place?

Isn't this time perfect again for God to remind us or do something to bring attention back to His Son? I realized as I was thinking this—we are meant to keep Jesus in the season. We as Christians, we as a church are meant to be a witness to others. God called us! Mark 16:15 says, And he said to them, "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation." What better time and opportunity to spread the love and word of Jesus Christ than during this Christmas season? Pray for someone, invite someone to church, witness to another, be kind to others in the long lines, or find a community of believers with whom to worship. These are just a few ideas I have for bringing the love of the Christ Child to others in a time that is really stressful to many.

May the blessings of God's Son, Jesus Christ, be upon you this December. May you find some time to reflect on FAITH, family, church, and friends.




Methodist Men's News

Easy Cinnamon Roll Casserole

Ingredients needed:

2 tubes Pillsbury Grand cinnamon rolls (17.5 oz size works best)

1/4 cup melted butter

2 eggs

1/2 cup heavy whipping cream

2 tbsp. flour

3 tsp cinnamon

1 tsp vanilla extract

1/2 cup finely chopped pecans

Icing from rolls

Powdered sugar

Directions:

Melt butter and coat 9X13 pan. (Extra is fine.) In a bowl, beat eggs, cream, flour, cinnamon and vanilla.

Open canned rolls and cut into pieces. Place pieces into egg mixture and toss to coat thoroughly. Pour all of this into prepared pan. Sprinkle with pecans

Bake at 350 degrees until light golden brown. (Make sure middle dough is done.) Melt icing and pour over pieces. Sprinkle with powdered sugar.

Creamy Chicken Tortilla Soup Ingredients needed:

2 Chicken breasts

2 tbsp. butter

1 small yellow onion, chopped

1 jalapeño pepper, diced

3 cloves garlic, smashed

1 tbsp. tomato paste

1 15 oz can corn, drained

1 10 oz Rotel diced tomatoes with green chilies, undrained

1 15 oz can of black beans, drained & rinsed

5 cups chicken broth

1 pinch Cayenne pepper

1 tsp cumin

1 taco packet

1 1/2 cups cheddar cheese, softened

1/3 cup cream cheese, softened

Directions: In a skillet, soften onion, pepper and garlic.

I do this in a crockpot over low for 6 hours...Put all ingredients except cheese and cream cheese in crockpot with chicken on the bottom. After 5 hours on low, take chicken out and shred it and put back in the crockpot.

Add cheese and cream cheese, that are softened. Stir as it melts to combine. Let cook another hour.

Serve with tortilla chips, avocado, cheese, and sour cream, if desired.

**I have used Rotisserie chicken and cooked for 3 hours on low just so flavors combine.


May all the blessings of the Christ Child come to you and your loved ones during this season. May you find some time to reflect on the season's true meaning in all the hurry and scurry!


